

## Joshua Burnham

is a direct product of The Ballet Alliance. Josh started his training with the school of Santa Cruz Ballet Theatre, then moved to eastern Washington and continued his training with Debra Pearse Rogo and Mid-Columbia Ballet. Upon graduation, Josh was a trainee with San Francisco Ballet and danced for six seasons with Cincinnati Ballet. He settled at Manassas Ballet, where he danced, taught in the school and was Ballet Master for twelve years. Josh retired from the stage last spring, returning home to Tri-Cities Washington. He now fills the crucial role of Associate Director of Mid-Columbia Ballet and teaches all levels at MCB's official school, Tri-Cities Academy of Ballet.
